MESSAGE FROM PRESIDENT & CEO



Dear Friends,

It would be easy to say the past year highlighted in this annual report was one of transition and change for the Fredericksburg Regional Food Bank. Certainly, that would be understandable as our community continued to adapt to the impactful presence of the coronavirus and the many changes it has brought to ordinary life. The Fredericksburg Regional Food Bank is the largest organization in the Central Rappahannock River Region working to solve hunger. By partnering with 146 community organizations in Caroline County, the City of Fredericksburg, King George County, Locust Grove, Spotsylvania County, and Stafford County - and distributing food directly into hard-to-reach areas **the FRFB is helping 29,000 people each year get access to healthy food.** That's 7.5% of our region's mothers, fathers, sons, daughters, sisters, brothers, and grandparents.

OrderAhead is the newest program of the FRFB. It provides the convenience of online ordering and choice from a menu of options

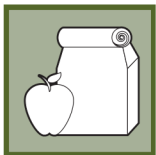
FEEDING SENIORS

We provide healthy snacks to students attending after school enrichment programs.

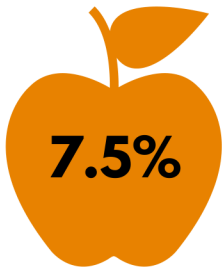
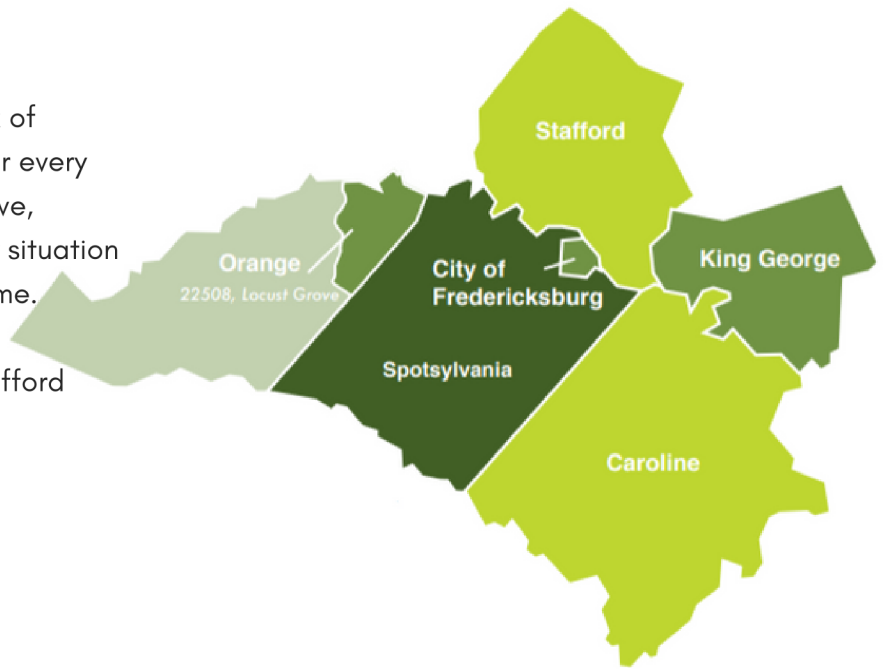


SCHOOL PANTRY

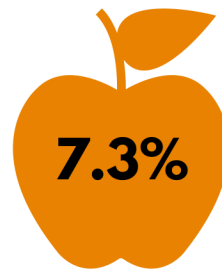
**CAROLINE COUNTY
FOOD INSECURITY RATE**



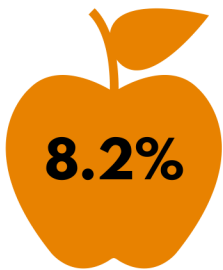

PARTNER SPOTLIGHT



Our Spotlight Pantry is **Chancellor Baptist Church** in Spotsylvania County. Run by Tracey and Rosemary Bailey, Chancellor Baptist Church's Pantry is a vital resource for people facing hunger. Read on to learn how your support has enabled this pantry to grow and adapt, even in the face of the challenges of the pandemic. Remember that when you support the food bank, you are helping us stock the pantries of more than 140 community partners!

“Like many churches, we had a very limited, basic food pantry for a long time (over 20 years). But we were only serving a handful of families and only providing a few basic products – some bread and a small bag of canned goods. Then about 10 years ago, we began to work in close partnership with the Fredericksburg Regional Food Bank. We were just making the transition to becoming a USDA site when the COVID crisis sent our numbers of needy families skyrocketing into the hundreds – every week. The timing was perfect because the food and crisis resources have been a godsend for our families.

The most obvious change since COVID hit is that we have transitioned to a “parking lot/curbside service” distribution. Like many pantries, before COVID we let families walk through our “market area” of tables and choose most of their own food. Now we interview food clients in their cars and give them some choices on a menu, but families can’t actually walk through the building and pick out their own food. Our other big challenge has been serving twice as many people, with much more critical levels of food needed per family. We now serve approximately 500 to 600 families per month, which is about 2,200 to 2,400 individuals per month. Of course, the amount of food available to us increased dramatically thanks to increased donations to the Food Bank, and also their access to USDA disaster relief food programs.



Our Food Pantry has benefited immeasurably from our partnership with the Food Bank. The Food Bank has shown us what to do, they have trained us and helped us in so many ways, and they work tirelessly every day just to make the food available to us and to all of its partner agencies, so we can distribute it to our families in need. The benefit is priceless and incalculable. We could not do any portion of what we do without the Fredericksburg Regional Food Bank and Feeding America.”

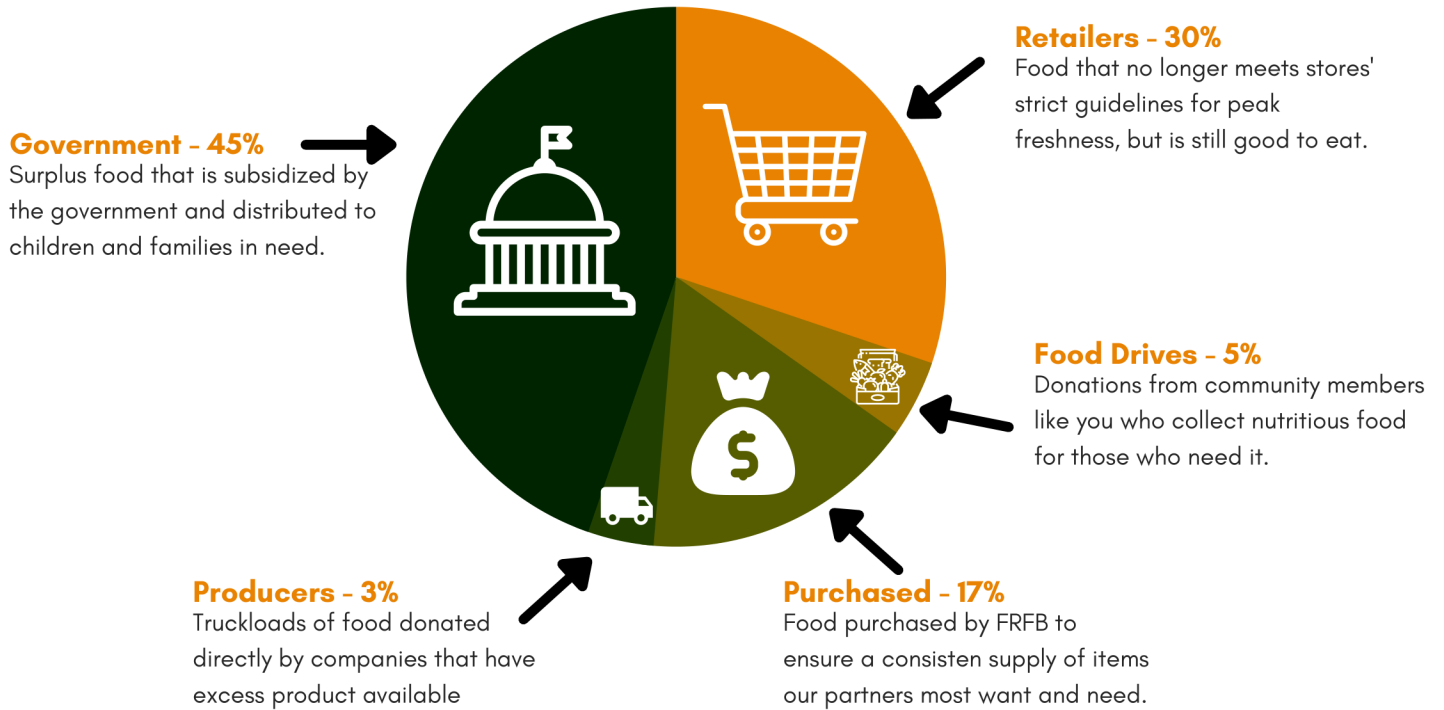

It is true that in the midst of every crisis, lies great opportunity. Fiscal Year 2021 presented many challenges to the FRFB and we are so grateful to our donors, volunteers, and community partners who helped us meet the skyrocketing need in our community. Everything changed from the way we managed operations and programs to a change in safety protocols in our distributions. We saw many people using the FRFB for the first time. Through all of this, the Food Bank maintained a resiliency and adaptability that always kept our mission at the forefront of our minds. If there was an increased need in our community, we were determined to be there for our neighbors. As always, the community stepped up to help.



When pantries and feeding sites closed, we had to regroup and rethink our methods of distribution. We added pop-up distributions to our mobile distribution schedule in easily accessed, high traffic areas such as the Expo Center and even had weekly distributions directly from the FRFB. Our Summer Feeding program evolved to distribute both breakfast and lunch and we were able to provide more meals than ever before. We added OrderAhead, which provided a convenient, safe way for our neighbors to receive groceries.

Many of these changes will endure. So, we can thank COVID for the roadblocks it threw in our path because some of our greatest innovations came as a result. Though we never imagined we would be here, we persevered thanks to your support, and we have stronger, more efficient programs to feed the community.
